Due to our ongoing expansion, here at Medical Aid International we are delighted to announce that we are looking for a new Intern(s).

This role is an exciting opportunity for someone interested in developing a career in the NGO healthcare/aid sector. At Medical Aid International, our role focuses on improving healthcare in the low resource environments that are prevalent in the developing world. This centres around practical solutions for equipment supply, the logistical support that accompanies this and education. This support may be in surgical units, hospitals, rural clinics and disaster relief situations. We also have a significant role in BioMedical Engineering support and accompanying education as well as general research.

What are we looking for? The most fundamental aspect to us is people with the right attitude and mindset. This means people who:

- Have a can do, solutions based approach to all situations.
- Demonstrate high levels of initiative.
- Have a sense of humour.
- Show real enthusiasm and passion for our work.

We can teach the role and the medicine if our Intern has the above attributes. As an organisation, we place a lot of emphasis on personal development, enhancing strengths and nurturing areas that need developing.

The exact role will depend on the applicant but as a guideline the following will apply:

1. The role is based in Bedford. Of course, if someone needs to move here we will help them in finding accommodation.
2. It is a paid role. The salary depends on age and experience.
3. It will be for nine months with a view to it becoming a full-time position.
4. Overseas travel will be included to help at and experience projects.
5. The successful applicant(s) will work in all areas of the organisation.

6. Whilst we are expecting many potential applications to be interested in the overseas aspects with the associated travel to these environments, we recognise that excellent people may wish to work with us who do not wish to travel. We would be really pleased to hear from these people as well.
